Retain all existing arrangements and support for the network of Regional Centres (and Clubs)

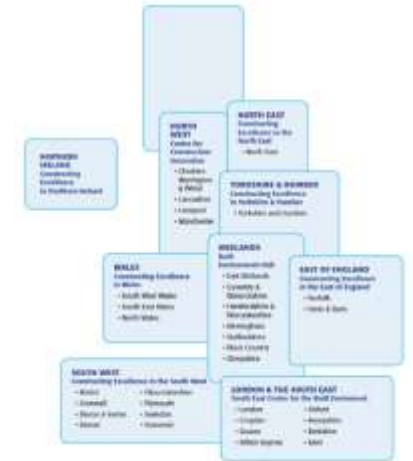
Grow and expand this network, e.g. in Scotland

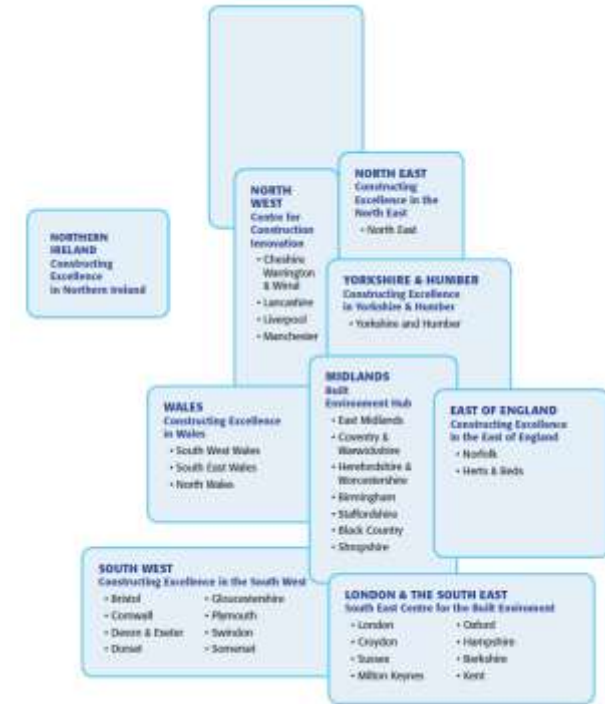
